What is Vocational Education and Training Delivered to Secondary Students (VETDSS)?

The VETDSS program enables school students to undertake a VET course as part of their senior secondary education.

VETDSS programs at NR TAFE are available to all high school students across the North West who would like to gain a Qualification while they are still at school.

One of the great aspects of VETDSS is students in years 10, 11 and 12 can complete courses while working towards their Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE).

What do I get out of a VETDSS Course?

- A nationally recognised Qualification, Skill Set or Part Qualification
- It contributes to your WACE
- Real life experience with industry experts
- Industry-specific knowledge and skills for a head start
- A pathway to further study, employment or an Apprenticeship or Traineeship.

Why is this program suitable for me?

- It develops work, employability and life skills
- Provides a head start in other nationally recognised Qualifications

- Broadens your career options
- Helps increase your self-esteem, confidence and communication skills
- Improves your employment prospects
- Can lead to pathways of immediate employment or further education including Diploma or University studies.

About training at NR TAFE

- Training is available to students in years 10, 11 and 12
- · Places are limited
- All training Qualifications are nationally recognised and comply with strict quality standards
- VETDSS training can be delivered at school, on one of our campuses, workshops, online or simulated work environments
- Some courses require workplace learning and experience
- Students are limited to two profile-funded Qualifications or one profile-funded Qualification and one Skill Set for their secondary schooling (i.e. year 10-12) to maximise student access to feefree training.

The courses offered in this guide are mainly Certificate II Qualifications.

TAFE courses are offered at different levels from Certificate I – Diploma.

Most students choose to build their career by stepping through the levels. You can even gain access to university via TAFE courses.

High level of skilled work in a supervisory position

Many of our programs are held in workshops and classrooms that offer modern, state-of-the-art facilities and equipment. Students are given hands-on training on campus, in simulated workplaces or on-site in the workplace, giving them both practical skills and theoretical knowledge to guarantee well-balanced training.

Fees and charges

Secondary school students enrolled in the VETDSS program are exempt from tuition, resource and enrolment fees. However, depending on the Qualification, students may be required to purchase personal protective equipment and/or textbooks.

Work experience

Some courses may involve workplace experience to support the learning program. Students will be advised by their lecturer if this is the case, and in some instances, it is the responsibility of the student or the school to organise work experience.

How we can help you

NR TAFE is committed to helping students reach their career and study goals by providing a range of support services.

NR TAFE's Disability Support Coordinator can provide information and advice and arrange individual study support with students.

Students under the VETDSS program will have the additional support of their School VET Coordinator and NR TAFE's School Delivery Coordinators whilst studying.

How parents/caregivers can help

Parents and caregivers can help their child's decision-making by following these steps:

- Discuss with their child career aspirations for when they leave school and help them to determine the subjects that will best help them achieve these aspirations.
- Speak with the School VET Coordinator to identify the VET options available in their region and the requirements involved to help their child make an informed decision.

Should parents have any questions regarding the pathway, they should contact their child's school VET Coordinator, or contact NR TAFE to discuss the Oualifications offered.





How to enrol in a VETDSS Qualification

- 1. Students must be enrolled and attending high school to enrol in the VETDSS program, and be in either year 10, 11 or 12.
- 2. Make an appointment to speak to your school's VET Coordinator about what VETDSS Qualifications are available to senior students at your school.
- 3. Discuss career goals with your parents/caregivers and teachers, then advise your VET Coordinator of your preferences.
- 4. Apply to your school to secure a place.

Please remember that places are limited in the VETDSS program.



What do I need to enrol in a VETDSS Qualification?

- Your SCSA (School Curriculum & Standards Authority) number. This can be found on your school report or you can speak with your VET Coordinator at school.
- Your Unique Student Identifier (USI) number. If you do not already have a USI, please visit usi.gov.au.
- Parent/guardian details and an emergency contact.

Aboriginal School Based Training

Aboriginal School Based Training (ASBT) provides opportunities for Aboriginal students in years 10, 11 and 12 to gain a Qualification.

Students learn about the world of work, workplace expectations, explore careers and training areas, as well as undertake real or simulated work projects. The training is specifically designed to be engaging and encourages students to go into further training, a traineeship or employment. Schools need to apply for placements under ASBT through their School Sector Representative.





Pre-Apprenticeships in School

Pre-apprenticeships in school (PAIS) are Certificate II programs that have been nominated by Western Australian training councils as valid pathways from school to related Apprenticeships. Students attend school, train at TAFE and are linked to an employer for work placement or undertake simulated work placement. Students must complete a work placement as nominated in the Pre-Apprenticeship program.

NR TAFE coordinates placements in partnership with the schools. Students undertaking a PAIS program are exempt from tuition, resource and enrolment fees. However, depending on the Qualification, students may be required to purchase personal protective equipment and/or text books.

School Based Traineeships and Apprenticeships

NR TAFE offers programs whereby students can start as a Trainee or Apprentice while still at school. School-based Apprenticeships and Traineeships are paid employment based training arrangements formalised in a National Training Contract made between the employer and the student (and guardian). School Based Apprenticeships or Traineeships are available as part of the VETDSS program.

Students will undertake a variety of study at school, training with NR TAFE and will be contracted to work and train with an employer. This gives students the chance to complete the requirements of a nationally recognised Qualification and will have the opportunity to graduate from school with their WACE.

How to sign up as a School Based Trainee or Apprentice

It is vital to the success of a School Based Trainee or Apprentice (SBT/A) to ensure that the student is well matched to the employment based training opportunity. Students need to consider what their interests, aspirations and abilities are, and to share these with their guardians and school.

These will then be matched to the employer's capacity to provide work based training that is complementary and appropriate to those interests, aspirations and ability, as well as to the requirements of the SBT/A Qualification. Students or the school may approach an employer to discuss the possibility of setting up a SBT/A, or alternatively a Group Training Organisation may be utilised to help find an employer. There are many stakeholders involved in a SBT/A, including the student, their guardians, the school, the employer and NR TAFE.





Leaving school - Notice of arrangement

For young people in years 11 and 12 there are a range of approved education options available, which meet the *School Education Act (1999)*. Students can leave school as long as they participate in an approved study/training option that is considered full time. This means students can study at NR TAFE full time, do a combination of TAFE and employment, or even take on an Apprenticeship or Traineeship.

Students in year 10 or below may be eligible to seek an exemption from their school and request permission to participate in activities other than full time school, which may include attending TAFE.

NR TAFE offers engagement programs, certificates in general education to improve numeracy and literacy, full and part Qualifications, and Skill Sets. Additional support is available through Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) lecturers, the Aboriginal Training Services Team, disability support, and mentors.

School students aged 15-18 years old not enrolled at school are eligible for a concession rate and fee cap. Please see our Fees and Charges Policy for more information.
